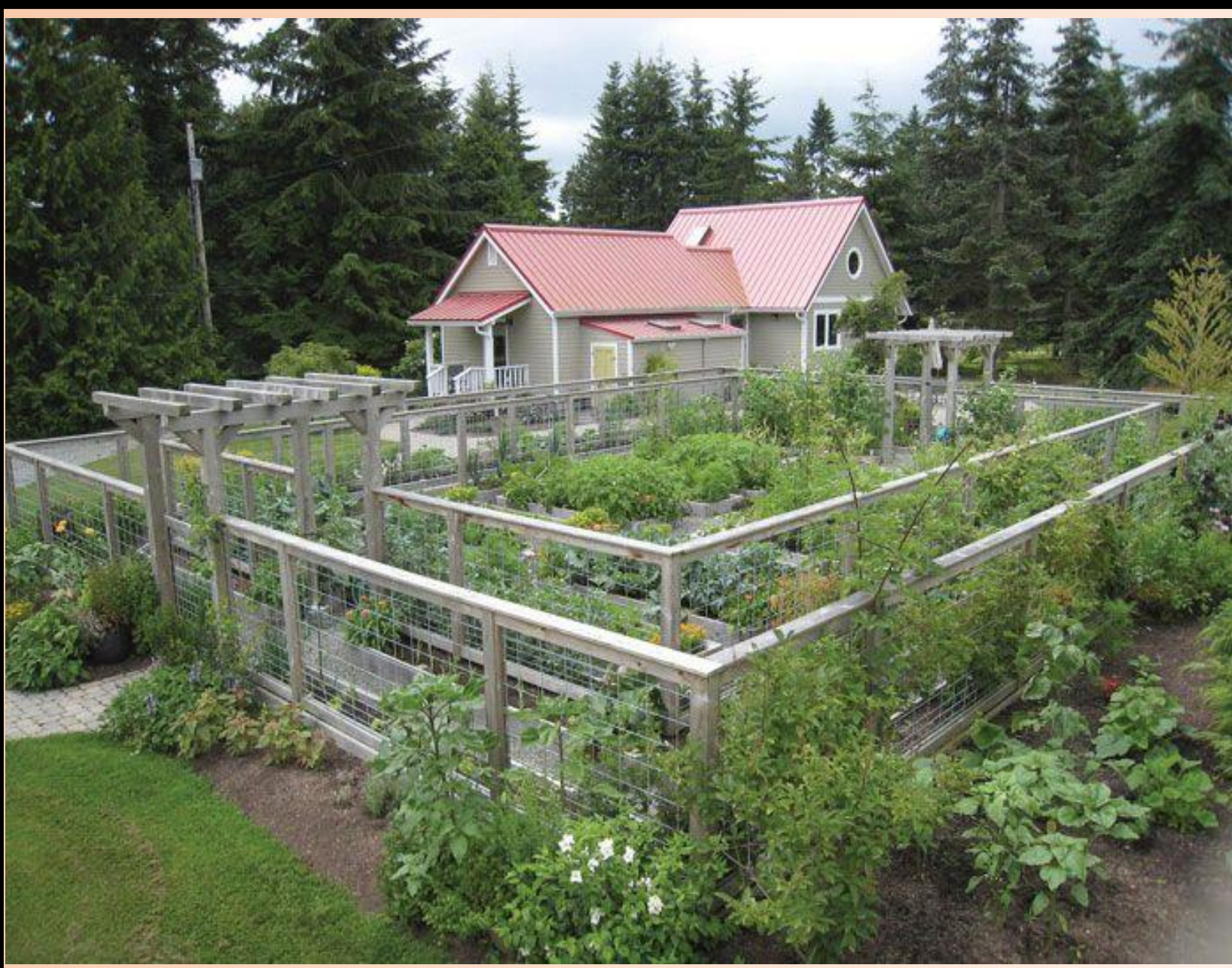
Cutting in Permanent Rain Gardens

All will grow well in our poorly drained soils and are considered super foods.

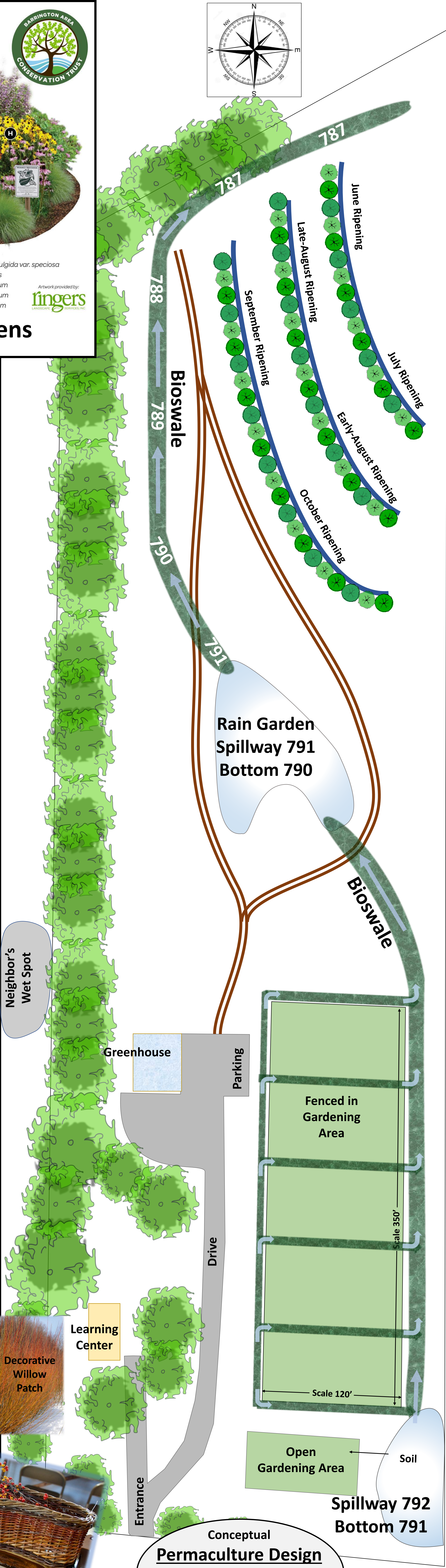


Double-Deer Fence

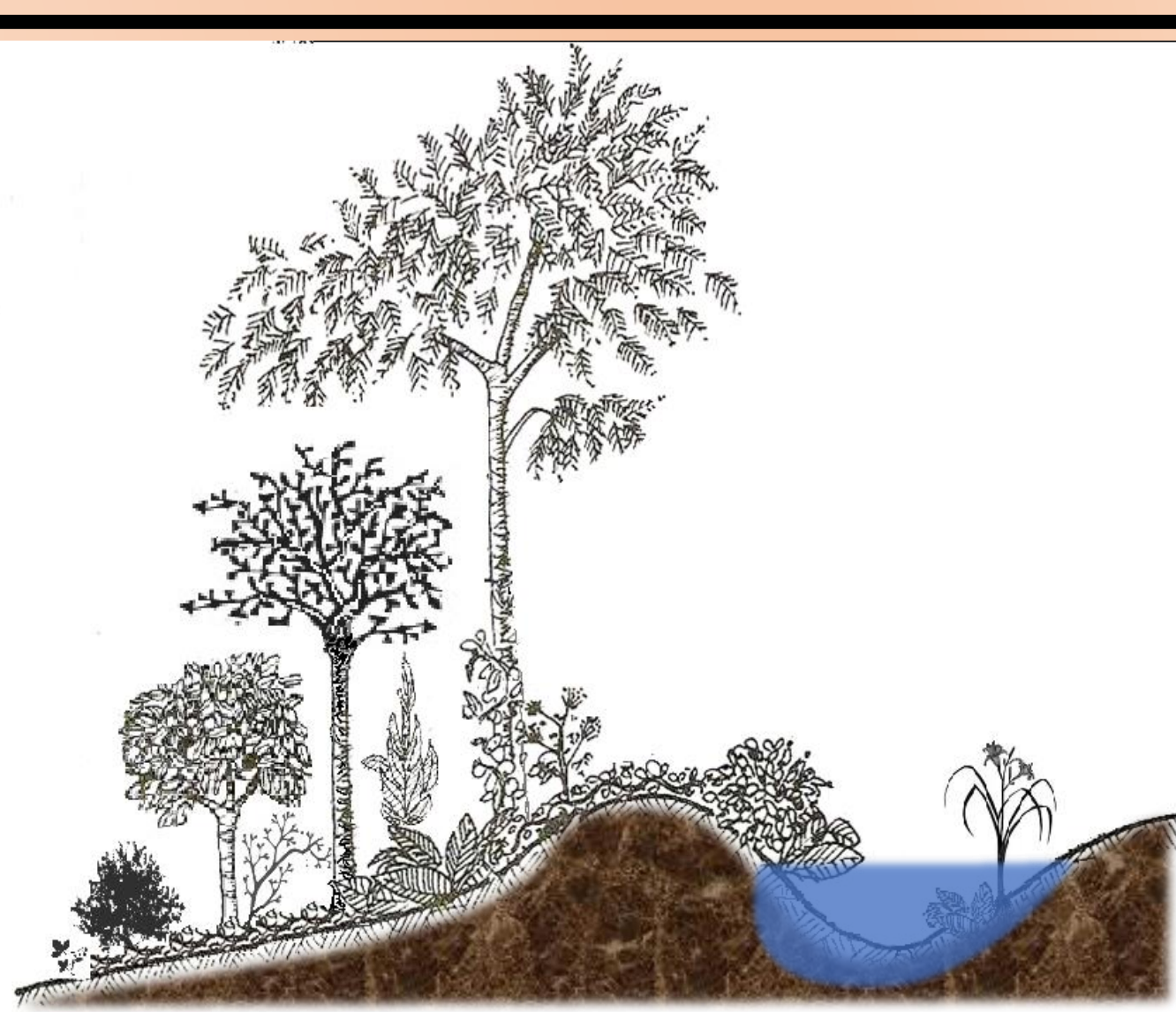
Various parallel fencing patterns will keep deer from accessing a planted area.



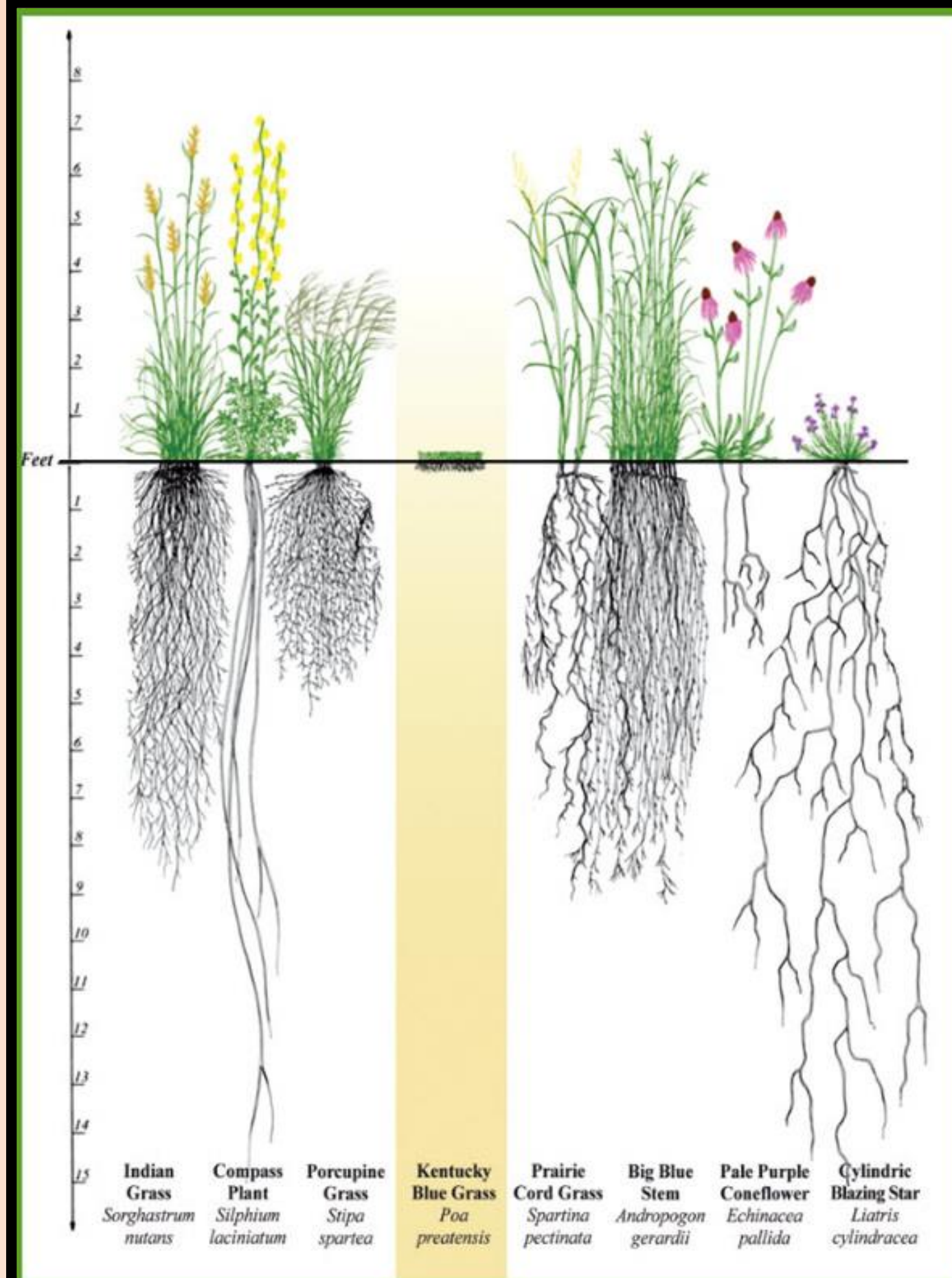
